### Youth Strategy Action Plan

Council has taken a leadership role in developing a youth strategy. It was developed in conjunction with partner agencies, Ministry of Youth Development, Ministry of Social Development, Waikato District Health Board, local schools and youth support networks. The outcome of consultations with stakeholders and Community Boards was that the Strategy would be a starting point of a shared journey, rather than the end result.

#### Implementation

A Thames-Coromandel Youth Steering Group will be established, hosted by the Thames-Coromandel District Council

Within the terms of reference for this group will be the ability to establish short-term working groups to develop detailed action plans, outline timeframes, set targets, determine success indicators, and identify lead agencies, for each of the themes.

The Steering Group will meet twice a year to share current information regarding youth issues and provide an oversight of progress against any agreed actions in this plan.

#### Review

The document will be reviewed on an annual basis by the Council's Strategic Planning Team Leader and the Council's Chief Executive to ensure that the work programme for Council remains relevant.
